RE: Response to August 22, 2007 Inquiry Letter Regarding CPSC Recall

Dear Congressman Rush and Congressman Stearns:

This office represents Crimzon Rose International, Inc. f/k/a Crimzon Rose Accessories, Inc. ("CRI"), and I am writing in response to your letter of August 22, 2007 regarding the lead content in children's products. In response to the corresponding numbered questions in your letter, we are supplying the following information:


1. CRI is unaware of any other children's products imported by CRI with lead paint or lead content that exceeds lawful safety standards.
2. CRI is unaware of the exact level of lead in the recalled jewelry, other than as reported by CPSC.
3. The jewelry in question was manufactured in China by Rihong Jewelry, Ligezhuang Industrial Park, Jiaozhou City, Qingdao, China.
4. Our agreements with all Chinese manufacturers limit the use of lead and other hazardous products to acceptable levels in accordance with applicable safety standards.
5. CRI requires all manufacturers in China to conduct testing, and CRI now conducts its own testing as well.
6. CRI discovered the lead in the jewelry that lead to the CPSC recall of February 23, 2007 when it was contacted by its customer, Sears Holdings

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- Company d/b/a Kmart Corporation ("Kmart"). Kmart as the retailer communicated with CPSC about the items in question, not CRI.
7. We cooperated with Kmart in the recall action. The Kmart Legal Department handled the issuance of the consumer information and the consumer warnings, not CRI.
 8. CRI is unaware of any details of the consumer response to the recall, because the consumer relations aspect of the recall was handled by Kmart, not CRI.

Please let me know if you need any additional information. Obviously, we are willing to cooperate with the Subcommittee in any way we can.
