RE: Committee Investigation Relating to the Safety of the Nation's Food Supply

Dear Chairman Dingell and Chairman Stupak:

On behalf of Kellogg Company ("Kellogg" or "Company"), I am responding to your May 8, 2008 letter requesting certain information in connection with the Committee investigation noted above. Food safety is obviously a matter of primary importance at Kellogg, and we demonstrate this commitment by focusing on adherence to good manufacturing practices ("GMP") and implementation of appropriate verification procedures. We understand the importance of the Committee's investigation and are happy to provide the information requested.

Preliminary Comments

We respectfully request that you not publicly disclose information contained in this response or its attachments which we have designated as "Confidential and Proprietary/Privileged Information." If such disclosure is anticipated, we further respectfully request that we be given notice of your intent to disclose before any such disclosure occurs.

Kellogg Responses to Requests for Information

We are providing the information in the order of the requests set forth in your Letter.

1. **Food Recalls and Food Safety Alerts.**

Kellogg has conducted a limited number of product recalls and/or withdrawals since January 1, 2000, most of which have involved allergen issues. Responsive information is provided in **Exhibit 1**.

2. **Internal Microbiological Testing.**

Responsive information is provided in **Exhibit 2**.

3. **Internal Chemical Contaminant Testing.**

We are not aware from our review of our records of any incidents where internal finished product testing resulted in positive findings for the presence of chemical contaminants during the period covered by your Letter.


6. Denial of Access to Company Facilities or Records on Microbiological/Chemical Testing.

We are not aware from our review of our records of any instances where a Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") or state regulatory official has been denied access to either a Kellogg facility or to records relating to microbiological/chemical testing. By Company policy, our teams understand the importance of compliance with governmental authorities on matters concerning our food and our manufacturing practices. This process similarly includes requesting, for security, safety and other reasons, that inspectors comply with certain credential verification and plant access conditions. We may also ask that requests be clarified or put in writing. However, we are not aware of any instance where access to facilities or relevant records has been denied an FDA or state regulatory official following a proper request.
