Enclosure 1

Response to Questions

Question 1. Please specify in detail the cleanup work and activities that will not be performed or for which funds have not yet been allocated at sites that need additional funding to initiate new cleanup projects or expedite work at ongoing cleanup projects, based on regional requests.

Answer. During Fiscal Year 2004, the Superfund program funded all ongoing remedial projects at a level sufficient to maintain the effective progress towards protection of long-term threats to human health and towards construction completion. In addition, the program obligated over \$100 million towards 27 new construction projects. Enclosure 2 includes obligation information on the projects ranked by the National Prioritization Panel that received funding (including Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) settlement resources) in Fiscal Year 2004. As indicated in our October 13, 2004, response to your initial request, 34 projects were not funded in Fiscal Year 2004, of which 15 projects were in the design phase and not ready to receive construction funding. The remaining 19 projects have been stabilized and secured by earlier Superfund activities and do not pose an immediate threat to human health. Enclosure 3 contains fact sheets with information on cleanup work and activities associated with these 34 unfunded projects.

Question 2. Please identify the ongoing remedial projects that are not sufficiently funded to date and the dollar shortfall for each, based on regional requests.

Answer. All Superfund remedial action funding decisions are made in close coordination with EPA regional offices after a careful review of each project. These discussions result in a better understanding of the project schedule, type of project activities, and when in the fiscal year estimated funding requests would be needed. EPA Headquarters and the regions continue to work together extensively throughout the year to balance the Superfund program's human health and environmental protection responsibilities with both individual site needs and overall national priorities. Through this collaborative process, EPA Headquarters Superfund program managers decide on site and project funding levels that make the best use of the funds that we have. Therefore, we are submitting the final funding levels arrived at through this collaborative process. As EPA stated in fiscal years 2003 and 2004, the appropriated level of program funding did not permit the Superfund program to start long-term construction at every site that was ready to begin construction.

Enclosure 4 provides information on the amount of funding obligated (including PRP settlement resources) in Fiscal Year 2004 for ongoing and other construction work at projects not included in Enclosure 2.

Question 3. Please identify the removal projects not sufficiently funded to date and the dollar shortfall for each, based on regional requests.

Answer. As indicated in our October 13, 2004, response, removal action funding decisions are generally made by the Regions, with their top priority being emergency responses necessary to protect human health and the environment. As with ongoing construction projects, the Regions and Headquarters work together to address important funding needs if they arise and ensure that emergency situations are funded. Non-emergency removal actions are funded to the extent that resources are available. Enclosure 5 provides information on non-emergency removal actions not ranked through by the National Prioritization Panel at which greater than \$2 million in funding was obligated (including PRP settlement resources) in Fiscal Year 2004.

Question 4. Please identify the pipeline projects not sufficiently funded to date and the dollar shortfall for each, based on regional requests.

Answer. As indicated in our October 13, 2004, response, EPA Headquarters does not allocate resources to the Regions site-specifically for pipeline projects, but we do adjust the allocation of resources for remedial action and pipeline work among the Regions to balance the flow of work and maintain effective site-cleanup progress nationwide. During the course of the year, a Region uses its pipeline resources to make funding decisions by considering site- and non-site-specific resource needs (e.g., funding for State core Superfund programs, records management) as well as balancing individual site needs with overall program implementation progress in the Region. Enclosure 6 provides information on site-specific obligations (including PRP settlement resources) in Fiscal Year 2004. Note that these data only represent site-specific project obligations and do not reflect all pipeline resources used by the Regions.

Question 5. Please provide the current status, including funds allocated to date for fiscal year 2004, as well as the type and dollar amount of the cleanup work or activities ready to proceed for the following projects: Eastland Woolen Mill (ME), Barber Orchard (NC), Callaway and Son Drum Services (FL), Brewer Goal (SC), Pepper Steel (FL), Reasor Chemical Company (NC), Tar Creek (OK), Valley Park TCE (MO), Arsenic Trioxide (ND), Midvale Slag (UT), McCormick and Baxter (CA), San Gabriel Valley Area 4 (CA), Tucson Airport International (AZ), Commencement Bay-South Takoma Channel (WA), Wyckoff-Eagle (WA).

Answer. The information provided in the October 13, 2004, response with regard to funding in Fiscal Year 2004 and explanation of the current status of each of these sites is the most recent information available. To date, Headquarters is not aware of any unmet regional funding requests for these projects.
