



Biography of Walter Bradley

Walter grew up in Clovis and attended Eastern New Mexico University. He began his professional career in Dallas, Texas with Texas Instruments, and then National Chemsearch. In 1976, Walter returned to Clovis where he started a very successful real estate career.

Walter was first elected to the New Mexico State Senate in 1989, Lt. Governor in 1994, and Lt. Governor again in November of 1998. As Senator, Walter represented the interests of the people of New Mexico on the Economic Development and Education Committees. As Lt. Governor, and the President of the Senate, he served on the New Mexico Space Commission Board and the New Mexico Border Authority. Walter was on the Executive Board for the Workforce Development Board and Chairman of the Small Business Advocacy Council. He served as “Honorary Chairman” of the New Mexico Resource Advisory Council, and was appointed as New Mexico’s point man on Federal Environmental Relations.

In January 2003 after two consecutive terms as Lt. Governor of New Mexico, Governor Bradley took a position as Assistant Land Commissioner overseeing the Commercial and Special Projects Division.

In July 2004 former Lt. Governor Bradley accepted his current position with Dairy Farmers of America. He oversees Business and Government Relations in New Mexico and the southwest area.

Walter has received numerous certificates of recognition for service to New Mexico’s citizens. Some are Who’s Who of Financial and Industry, Who’s Who in the West, NAACP Leadership Award, “Man of the Year” for Progressive Farmer Magazine, “Citizen of the Year” for New Mexico Farm Bureau, and several private business awards.

Walter is active in his church, and has served on the board of the Curry County United Way, the Curry County Economic Board, the Clovis Board of Realtors, the Realtors Association of New Mexico, the Lion’s Club, and the Jaycees.

Walter and his wife, Deborah, were married in Clovis where they raised their four children, Tige, Lance, Nicole, and Kristin. Lt. Governor Bradley and Debbie are also the proud grandparents of their granddaughters, Alexis, Deavyn, Courtney, and Jaklyn and one grandson Colton.
