Timothy J. Scott is the Chief Security Officer & Corporate Director of Emergency Services & Security (ES&S) for The Dow Chemical Company. In this role Scott leads Dow's global ES&S expertise and operational organizations in over 200 locations around the world, as well as Dow's multi-functional Chemical Security & Public Safety Issues Management Team which coordinates Dow's advocacy initiatives in security, crisis management and emergency-related venues. Scott has testified in this capacity before committees of both the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate. Scott is also a member of Dow's Corporate Crisis Management Team.

Scott served from 2007-2009 on the executive committee of the Chemical Sector Coordinating Council affiliated with the Department of Homeland Security, and the multi-sector Partnership for Critical Infrastructure Security. Scott was a member of the inaugural National Maritime Security Advisory Committee created by the Department of Homeland Security, and currently co-chairs a Chemical Sector Case Study on Information Sharing sponsored by the National Infrastructure Advisory Council.

Scott is a Certified Protection Professional with ASIS International; and a member of the International Security Managers Association, the American Chemistry Council Security Committee and the Conference Board Business Continuity & Crisis Management Council.

Scott joined Dow in 1979 and progressed through a number of assignments in public relations, emergency services and security. In 1988 Scott moved into site responsibilities for ES&S at Dow's Texas Operations site – the largest chemical manufacturing facility in the United States -- and added U.S. area and global responsibilities in 1999.

Before joining Dow, Scott was an officer in the U. S. Navy, serving on the first crew of the USS NIMITZ and in the Navy's New York City Office of Information.

In 2007 Scott was named by Security Magazine as one of the 25 most influential security executives in the U.S. Scott was also a finalist for the Leadership Excellence Award sponsored by the Harvard Business Review and the United States Naval Academy's Stockdale Center for Ethical Leadership.

Scott is a graduate of the U. S. Naval Academy earning a Bachelor of Science degree in international relations; with post graduate and executive education courses taken at the Joint Armed Services Defense Information School, New York Institute of Technology and Kellogg School of Business at Northwestern University.
