Elisa Derby has 14 years experience in the energy sector working on issues of energy, health and development. At Winrock International she manages Winrock household energy and health programs, with projects and partnerships that reduce exposure to energy-related indoor air pollution, providing technical support, strategic planning, and implementation and budget management. She currently co-coordinates U.S. EPA household energy capacity building activities, promoting effective approaches to increase the use of clean, reliable, affordable, efficient and safe home cooking and heating practices, and co-coordinated the predecessor Partnership for Clean Indoor Air. Ms. Derby also coordinates the World Bank Biomass Energy Initiative for Africa, consisting of 9 innovative pilot biomass energy projects throughout sub-Saharan Africa to help modernize the biomass energy sector. Ms. Derby is the Indoor Air Pollution Specialist for the WASHplus project, which creates supportive environments for healthy households and communities through high-impact water supply, sanitation, hygiene and indoor air quality interventions. She previously managed Winrock's \$1M "Reduction of Exposure to Indoor Air Pollution through Household Energy and Behavioral Improvements" USAID Associate Award supporting sustained adoption of improved energy technologies and practices to improve indoor air quality and reduce associated health impacts. She also managed the \$1.3M Global Village Energy Partnership (GVEP) Action Programs Fund (GAPFund) on behalf of GVEP and the World Bank to increase access to modern energy services, with 20 grantees in 11 countries. Ms. Derby also managed Winrock's renewable energy activities in Central America, overseeing implementation of energy service delivery projects focusing on strengthening livelihoods through productive use applications of clean energy, and clean energy policy support projects.
