A BILL

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Easy Medication Ac-
5 cess and Treatment for Opioid Addiction Act” or the
6 “Easy MAT for Opioid Addiction Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ADMINISTRATION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS FOR THE**
2 **PURPOSE OF RELIEVING ACUTE WITH-**
3 **DRAWAL SYMPTOMS.**

4 Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
5 of this Act, the Attorney General shall revise section
6 1306.07(b) of title 21, Code of Federal Regulations, so
7 that practitioners are allowed to administer not more than
8 a three-day supply of medication to one person or for one
9 person's use at one time.

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
