WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2020

The Committee on Energy and Commerce met, pursuant to notice, at 11:06 a.m., a quorum being present, for a virtual markup on the Committee's Webex platform, Hon. Frank Pallone, Jr. (Chairman of the committee) presiding. The business before the committee was consideration and markup of 38 bills pending before the full Committee. The following actions were taken:

1. **H.R. 1289**, the "Preserving Home and Office Numbers in Emergencies Act of 2019" (*Rep. Thompson of CA, et. al.*), was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 1289:

- **An Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** (H1289_ANS_FC_01), offered by Ms. Eshoo, was agreed to by a voice vote.

2. **H.R. 3957**, the "Expanding Broadcast Ownership Opportunities Act of 2019" (*Rep. Butterfield of NC, et. al.*), was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 3957:

- **Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** (H3957_ANS_FC_01), offered by Mr. Butterfield, was agreed to by a voice vote.

3. **H.R. 5564**, the "Enhancing Broadcaster Diversity and Inclusion by Verifying and Ensuring the Reporting required by Statute Is Transpiring and Yielding Data Act" or the "Enhancing Broadcaster DIVERSITY Data Act" (*Rep. Clarke of NY*), was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

4. **H.R. 1754**, the “Horseracing Integrity Act of 2019” (*Reps. Tonko of NY and Barr of KY*), was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a roll call vote: 46 – 5 (*Roll call [no. 61](#)*) (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 1754:

- **Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** (TONKO_035), offered by Mr. Tonko, was agreed to by a roll call vote: 46 – 5 (*Roll call [no. 60](#)*)
5. **H.R. 1379**, the “Ensuring Lasting Smiles Act” (*Rep. Peterson of MN*), was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

The following amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 1379:

7. **H.R. 2564**, the “Medicare Enrollment Protection Act” (*Reps. Schrader of OR, Bilirakis of FL, Thompson of CA, and Buchanan of FL*) was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

The following amendment was offered during consideration of H.R. 2564:

- **Amendment in the nature of a substitute (AINS) #1** (H2564-FC-ANS_01), offered by Mr. Schrader, on behalf of himself and Mr. Bilirakis, was agreed to by a voice vote.

8. **H.R. 8158**, A bill to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to waive budget neutrality for oxygen under the Medicare program, and for other purposes (*Rep. Rodgers of WA*), was ordered reported favorably to the House, **without amendment**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

No amendments were offered during consideration of H.R. 8158.

9. **H.R. 2075**, the “School-Based Health Centers Reauthorization Act of 2019” (*Reps. Sarbanes of MD, Tonko of NY, Stefanik of NY, and Upton of MI*) was ordered reported favorably to the House, **without amendment**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

10. **H.R. 4078**, the “EARLY Act Reauthorization of 2019” (*Reps. Wasserman Schultz of FL and Brooks of IN*) was ordered reported favorably to the House, **without amendment**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

11. **H.R. 4764**, the “Timely ReAuthorization of Necessary Stem-cell Programs Lends Access to Needed Therapies Act of 2019” or the “TRANSPLANT Act of 2019” (*Reps. Matsui of CA, Bilirakis of FL, and Pingree of ME*) was ordered reported favorably to the House, **without amendment**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

12. **H.R. 5855**, the “Bipartisan Solution to Cyclical Violence Act of 2020” (*Reps. Ruppertsberger of MD and Kinzinger of IL*) was ordered reported favorably to the House, **without amendment**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).

13. **H.R. 3131**, the “South Asian Heart Health Awareness and Research Act of 2020” (*Rep. Jayapal of WA*) was ordered reported favorably to the House, **amended**, by a voice vote (**Final Passage**).
