Dear Representative,

On behalf of Concerned Women for America Legislative Action Committee's (CWALAC) over 500, 000 members, we would like to express our support for H.R. 596, to “repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and health care-related provisions in the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010.” By repealing the Affordable Care Act (ACA), which a majority of the country opposed in the first place, Congress would prevent the imposition of numerous harmful burdens on Americans.

As we pointed out during the health care debate, the ACA provides government funding for elective abortions, imposes further taxes on the very people who desperately need financial relief, and allows the government to exert immense control in the health care sector. Government imposition in health care would result in bloated bureaucracies, as we have already seen with Medicare and Medicaid, budget shortfalls, denial of care, and erosion of quality.

We appreciate the initiative shown by members of the House in introducing this legislation and commend efforts to “repeal the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and health care-related provisions in the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010” to prevent the ACA from imposing major costs, red tape, and conscience concerns on Americans.
