



Susana M. Hildebrand, P.E.  
Chief Engineer, TCEQ

Susana M. Hildebrand, P.E., completed her BS in Aerospace Engineering and MS in Environmental & Water Resource Engineering at the University of Texas. Ms. Hildebrand began her career at the Texas Air Control Board in 1993. She has been a permit engineer in the Air Permits Division, writing permits and technical guidance for chemical plant and refinery authorizations. Ms. Hildebrand helped develop a number of emissions banking and trading programs and led numerous teams implementing federal regulatory requirements and state legislation. She has also served as a special assistant and technical advisor to the previous Chief Engineer of the Texas Commission of Environmental Quality (TCEQ).

In June 2006, Ms. Hildebrand became the Director of the TCEQ's Air Quality Division, which is responsible for developing the state implementation plan to restore air quality in areas in Texas exceeding the National Ambient Air Quality Standards. She directed air quality data analysis and state-of-the-art photochemical modeling in support of pollution control strategies and designs. Ms. Hildebrand was also responsible for the Emissions Inventory and Fee Assessments, the Emissions Banking and Trading Programs, the Mobile Source Programs and the Texas Emission Reduction Plan (TERP), which provides grant funds to reduce nitrogen oxide emissions from large mobile internal combustion engines.

Ms. Hildebrand was named chief engineer in July 2009. As chief engineer, Ms. Hildebrand reports directly to the executive director and serves as the science adviser for the executive office, specifically regarding executive-level technical and policy matters. In this role, the chief engineer monitors federal initiatives that may affect the implementation of federal regulations or whose implementation may result in adverse consequences to the environment, the state, or the TCEQ.

Ms. Hildebrand is a licensed professional engineer in the State of Texas.
