

## DAVID D. DONIGER

David Doniger is policy director and senior attorney for the Natural Resources Defense Council's Climate and Clean Air Program. Doniger has represented NRDC in many clean air cases, including *Massachusetts v. EPA*, the Supreme Court's landmark 2007 ruling that the Environmental Protection Agency must take action under the Clean Air Act to address the carbon pollution that causes global warming. Doniger leads the NRDC legal team helping defend EPA's initial carbon pollution standards against industry-led lawsuits and legislative attacks.

Doniger has also worked extensively under the Clean Air Act and the Montreal Protocol to protect the ozone layer by phasing out CFCs and dozens of other chemicals.

Doniger served for eight years in the Clinton administration, primarily as director of climate change policy at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. He worked at NRDC from 1978 to 1993 and rejoined NRDC in 2001.

Doniger holds a law degree and a masters in city and regional planning from the University of California at Berkeley, and a BA in history from Yale University. He is admitted to the California and District of Columbia bars.
