

David G. Frantz

David G. Frantz has served the Loan Programs Office since 2007 as the first Federal employee. Since October, 2011, Mr. Frantz has served as Acting Executive Director of the Loan Programs Office. Previously, Mr. Frantz served as the first Director of the Loan Programs Office from its inception through November, 2009. After November, 2009, Mr. Frantz served as the Director of the Origination division as well as the Advanced Technology Vehicles Manufacturing Loan Program during the two-year tenor of the White House-appointed executive director.

Mr. Frantz provides the caliber of leadership necessary to create a sound basis for technical and financial review of each application. Mr. Frantz has over 40 years of project finance experience, predominantly in energy, independent power and heavy infrastructure industries. Mr. Frantz has extensive experience in supervisory management, business development, project finance, mergers and acquisitions, and profit and loss responsibility.

Prior to his position at DOE, Mr. Frantz served 10 years as the Director of Project Finance for the Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC), where he managed a team with worldwide responsibilities for closing financial transactions.
