Dear Mr. Gorsky,

Pursuant to Rules X and XI of the United States House of Representatives, the Committee on Energy and Commerce is investigating reports that the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) may have solicited funding or assistance from your organization to help establish and implement the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA).

According to a May 10, 2013, *Washington Post* article, “[o]ver the past three months [HHS Secretary Kathleen] Sebelius has made multiple phone calls to health industry executives, community organizations and church groups and asked that they contribute whatever they can to nonprofit groups that are working to enroll uninsured Americans and increase awareness of the law” This article also quotes an HHS spokesman who claims that the Secretary “did not solicit for funds directly from industries that HHS regulates, such as insurance companies and hospitals, but rather asked them to contribute in whatever way they can.” Yet, the article claims that an industry official with knowledge of the HHS Secretary’s requests said “there was a clear insinuation by the administration that the insurers should give financially to the nonprofits.” Today, Secretary Sebelius told the Education and Workforce Committee she also contacted your organization.

HHS regulation of the health care industry will only grow under the PPACA. In order to better understand the efforts being made by the HHS Secretary and other groups to solicit help in establishing the PPACA, please provide the following information and documents no later than June 19, 2013.

1. Was your organization contacted by the HHS Secretary, any HHS employee, staff, or official, or any individual acting on behalf of HHS, including Enroll America or other third parties, relating to contributions to assist in the establishment and implementation of

the PPACA? Please provide a list of the individuals at your company who were contacted, who contacted them, and the date(s) they were contacted.

2. Please describe the substance of these communications. Provide all documents and communications, including materials describing, memorializing, summarizing, or otherwise relating to any communications with the Secretary or any other HHS officials regarding your organization's willingness to contribute to the implementation of the PPACA. This request includes, but is not limited to, internal memoranda, notes, or e-mail summarizing or discussing these conversations.
3. Please describe the outcome of these communications. Provide all materials describing, memorializing, summarizing, or otherwise relating to any plans, commitments, or initiatives by your company to contribute to the implementation of the PPACA. This request includes, but is not limited to, internal memoranda, notes, or e-mail summarizing or discussing these plans.
4. Please provide all materials related to any meetings held at the White House on the implementation of the PPACA. Describe the date(s) these meetings were held and provide a list of attendees as well as any materials related to these meeting. This would include any materials memorializing, summarizing, or otherwise relating to these meetings, including but not limited to e-mail communications. This request also includes any materials prepared for in anticipation of the meetings, obtained from another party during the meetings, or produced afterwards.
5. Was your organization contacted by anyone employed by or acting on behalf of Enroll America to contribute to or assist in the establishment and implementation of the PPACA or to contribute or assist Enroll America? Please provide a list of the individuals at your company who were contacted, who contacted them, and the date(s) they were contacted.
6. Please describe the substance of the communications requested in #5. Provide all documents and communications, including any documents or communications describing, memorializing, summarizing, or otherwise discussing these communications. This request includes, but is not limited to, internal memoranda, notes, or e-mail summarizing or discussing these conversations.
7. Was your organization contacted by former White House Deputy Chief of Staff Nancy-Ann DeParle to contribute to or assist in the establishment and implementation of the PPACA or to contribute or assist Enroll America? Please provide a list of the individuals at your company who were contacted, who contacted them, and the date(s) they were contacted.
8. Please describe the substance of the communications requested in #7. Provide all documents and communications, including any documents or communications describing, memorializing, summarizing, or otherwise discussing these communications. This request includes, but is not limited to, internal memoranda, notes, or e-mail summarizing or relating to these conversations.


