Dear Mr. Lauer:

Pursuant to Rules X and XI of the United States House of Representatives, the Committee on Energy and Commerce is examining contracts to implement the Patient Protection Affordable Care Act (PPACA) and build the health insurance exchanges required by the law.

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) has contracted with a number of companies to build the systems and databases that will facilitate open enrollment on October 1, 2013 and full implementation of the PPACA on January 1, 2014. Contractors have been retained for a number of services, including processing paper applications from consumers who apply for coverage through the exchanges¹ to creating the Data Services Hub, which will verify applicant information used to determine eligibility for enrollment in health plans.² EHealthInsurance recently announced an agreement to “sell exchange plans in states with federal-run insurance marketplaces.”³

In order to better understand the work you have contracted to do, and the status of that work in light of the scheduled open enrollment period beginning October 1, 2013, we ask that you provide a briefing to Committee staff to occur no later than August 16. That briefing should address the following:

1. A full description of the work required under your contract with HHS.⁴


2. The amount of funding and number of employees required to complete the work required by the contract.
3. The current status of your work. This would include, but is not limited to, any description of deadlines met or missed, timelines describing the process of the work, any HHS or other Executive Branch work plans or timelines, or any other measurements to indicate how the contracted responsibilities are proceeding.
4. Any changes or amendments HHS has made to the scope or timelines of the work since entering into the contract.

In addition, we ask that you provide the following documents to the Committee no later than August 19, 2013:

1. All documents, including contracts, work plans, schedules, timelines, or any other document related to your work on the PPACA. This would include, but is not limited to, materials prepared by your company, HHS, any other Executive Branch official, or a third party.
2. All communications, including e-mails, exchanged between HHS representatives or any other Executive Branch officials and your company relating to your work related to the PPACA. This would include, but is not limited to, reports or summaries of the work being performed, e-mail communications discussing this work, discussions of compensation, or any other materials.
3. Any internal memoranda, analysis, audits, or reports relating to the status of the work you are performing for HHS or the Executive Branch relating to the PPACA.





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
